Third American Continental Meeting

The Third American Continental Meeting of the International Forum of Catholic Action (IFCA) was held in Mexico City from April 6th to April 11th 1999, upon the topic of the special Assembly of the Bishops' Synod for America: "Meeting Jesus Christ today in America calls us to conversion, communion and solidarity and shows us the Father's love".

It was attended by representatives of the countries of the Continent which are IFCA's members: Argentina, Colombia, Mexico, Paraguay, Peru and Venezuela and by representatives from Italy, Spain and Romania, which together with Mexico and Argentina, make up IFCA's Secretariat. It was attended also by representatives from Ecuador, Panama and USA and from MIDADE's Regional Delegate, as observers.

The last post-synodal Exhortation Ecclesia in America was the doctrinal and pastoral point of reference of this meeting, which is part of the journey of the CA of the American continent towards the Great Jubilee of 2000.

As a matter of fact it aimed to foster dialogue and reflection in order to find some guidelines out which may enable the CA of each country to respond to its own reality properly.

Afer the welcome by the President of MCA's National Council and the presentation of the goals of the meeting by IFCA's Coordinator, Mons. Agostino Superbo, IFCA's Ecclesiastic Assistant, held a lecture upon "Meeting living Jesus Christ", foundation of every missionary action.

Mons. Carlos Talavera, Bishop of Coatzcoalcos and President of the Episcopal Commission of the Lay Apostolate in Mexico, held a lecture upon "What the Church and America expect from the lay people for the third millennium".

In the workshops the social dimension of conversion and CA's task as sign and instrument of reconciliation in society were particularly underlined. According to each country's reality, issues and areas of society were highlighted which need the reconciliatory presence of the Church; deeds and actions that CA together with other Lay Movements can undertake in order to contribute to the national reconciliation; signs and gestures of reconciliation inside the particular Churches.

Under the title "Third millennium, a challenge to formation", methods were laid out according to which the CA of the different countries are to prepare their members in order to respond to the challenges of the new century in a positive way.

The presentation of the experiences of the various countries, the exchange of fomative material and press, generated an atmosphere of solidarity and cooperation with the view of a common work among the different countries.

After the Mexican Party given by the CA Women of Mexico, the meeting closed with the Eucharistic celebration in the Basilica of our Lady of Guadalupe, presided by Mons. Agostino Superbo, ICA's General Assistant.

We, european youths attending the Second Week of formation promoted by the International Forum of Catholic Action in Oradea, Romania, we are glad to have shared an experience of prayer, reflection, study and joy.

Youth Coordination and World Youth Day 2000

One of the commitment of the Second Assembly is promoting IFCA's Youth Coordination and we are acting in this direction.

Two Weeks of formation for Youths were held at European level (IASI 98 and ORADEA 99); youths participated in the Third American Meeting in the delegations of the different countries (Mexico 99) and will be invited to the Third European Meeting (Poland 2000).

The participation of at least one youth was requested to IFCA's Third Assembly.

The World Youth Day in August 2000 has a special meaning in the journey towards the Third Assembly.

During the Secretariat's Meeting in October 99, we thought it important to favour meeting and exchange among CA youths who will participate in it.

 It is obvious that ICA's Youth Sector will be especially involved in welcoming CA youths who, together with the youths from the dioceses of the world, will be received by the youths of the italian dioceses.

URGENT: please inform IFCA's Secretariat in which diocese CA youths of other countries will be received, so that exchange and meeting with the youths of that diocese may be favoured.

2. IN ROME

In August a point of reception can be organised at ICA's location, via Conciliazione, I, with the participation of CA youths both from Italy and from other countries.

3. A "recognition sign" for the World Youth Day (a "logo") will be arranged. The material will be sent in advance, so that each country may "produce"its own sign directly or use that one ready according to its creativity.

Further indications follow end January, after the meeting of the Committee for the World Youth Day 2000 by the Pontifical Council for the Laity.

Both for the "Newsletter" as well as for this page on Internet, we need short information and data on what the different CA in the world have worked and how they are participating in the celebration of the Great Jubilee of 2000 in their own local realities, and in pilgrimages to Rome and to the Holy Land.

NEWS FROM THE COUNTRIES

Argentine

From August 14th to 16th of this year the Argentine Catholic Action held in San.

Juan the XXIII Federal Assembly upon the theme "Be one so that the world may believe".

About 15.000 ACA's members attended the Assembly. Together with the Bishops and the Assistants, they lived a real ecclesial celebration, with a strong evangelizing accent, expressed through an intense participation in the workshops where the participants could exchange projects and experiences linked to different aspects of social life: family, education, social problems, politics, work, science and faith, culture, art and communication, health and environment.

The Assembly was followed by two members of the Youth Section of the Italian Catholic Action and by MIDADE's latin-american representative.

The Assembly elected the new national leaders for the years 1999/2002 and Beatriz Buzzetti Thomson was elected again as national President.

Austria

At the end of September 1999 the Autumn General Assembly of Catholic Action of Austria took place in Innsbruck, Tyrol. This Assembly, which takes place twice a year, gathers 60 delegates from all over Austria. The representatives from the 10 Austrian dioceses take part and the different federal institutions organized by age, gender and professions.

At this Assembly the new Statutes were approved, which had been worked on for several years. Here are some of the changes:

- * Catholic Action Austria will receive the status of an inner church legal entity,
- There are 4 Movements according to age and gender: Women, Men, Youth and Children Organizations and 4 organizations according to professions: Academics, Workers, Students and Literature Forum.
- A new feature is the establishment of "forums", these are not organizations but institutions that will deliver some answers to issues of today's world. Four of these institutions will start next year:
- Labour, Economic Systems and Social Aspects
- Art, Sciences and Media
- Relationships, Marriage and Family
- Future Issues.

The Secretary General Ruth Steiner will retire and the Assembly elected Ludwig Martin in this position.

In November the Austrian Bishops Conference also approved the decisions of the Assembly.

Colombia

During the month of September 1999 the Colombian Catholic Action held its Assembly in Duitama upon the theme: "CA on its way towards conversion, communion and solidarity". The Assembly elected the new national leaders. Amparo Sardi ended her second mandate as President and Amelita Santa Maria de Pardo from Bucamaranga was elected in her place.

Italy

The Italian Catholic Action held the 10th national Assembly in Rome from 5th to 8th December 1998, upon the theme: "We cannot stop proclaiming what we have seen and heard" (Ac 4,20) - Witnesses of hope in the cities of men.

The almost 1.000 people representing all diocesan CA, partecipated actively in the works and approved the final document from which the guidelines for the years 1999/2002 were drawn up.

The Assembly came to an end with the Eucharistic Celebration presided by H.H. John Paul II in Saint Peter's Church on February 8th, when the whole Association celebrates the Enrolment-day, at 130 years from ICA's birth in Italy and at 30 years from the new post-conciliar Statutes. During his homily the Pope outlined ICA's mission "almost at the threshold of the third millennium: to act so that Italy may never miss the wonderful light of the Gospel you have always to announce openly

and to live consistently. Only in this way you will be credible witnessess to Christian hope and will be able to spread it to all".

ICA, after the 10th Assembly, has renewed its national leaders. The new national President is PAOLA BIGNARDI.

Romania

Malta

Members of the Malta Catholic Action met in General Assembly on Sunday 4th October 1999 to mark the launching of the social year 1999-2000.

The theme of the Assembly was "You too go out into the vineyard" (Math 20,4). The sound and light presentation depicting society in the year 2000 and the cry from specific sectors of society - namely the aged, adults, youth, adolescents, married couples, people with special needs, those of other beliefs, people involved in voluntary work, in mass media and in the field of culture - as well as the Mass and the National President's address all focused on the theme.

The meeting came to and end with a message by Mons. Annetto Depasquale, Auxiliary Bishop of Malta.

Mexico

on September 1999 the First national Meeting of the Mexican Catholic Action took place in León. 40 delegations representing the same number of dioceses of the country attended the meeting: 3.000 people, children, youths and adults.

The opening of the Meeting was presided by H.E. the Emeritus Bishop of Huajuapan de León, Mons. Josè de Jesus Aguilera, by the national Presidents of MCA's 5 branches and 4 movements.

During the Meeting, different lecturers spoke on the following topics: the Church's goal and work, the christian lay faitful in the life of the Church, formation and unity, CA's goals, organicity in CA and in the Church and what Mexico of the next century expects from the laypeople and from MCA.

Myanmar

On February 99 a course of formation for CA laypeople of Taunggyi, Loikaw and Taungoo dioceses was held in TAUNGGYI with IFCA's collaboration.

More than 100 people attended the meeting which was animated by Maria Giovanna Ruggieri and Marco Raengo of ICA.

This meeting allowed to know the small but lively reality of this CA, in a country where the Christians are discriminated, with a political situation of military dictatorship and a very poor economic condition.

The Bishop of Taunggyi, mons. Sotero Phamo, is asking for IFCA's help through scholarships for youths who cannot continue their studies in the universities closed by the regime, to enable them to study in the Philippines, engaging themselves to go back to their country. Romania

From 7th to 9th May 1999 the Holy Father paid an ecumenical visit to Romania.

He was invited by the catholic Bishops, the Republic's President and by the orthodox Church. It is to notice that Romania is a country with an orthodox majority and is considered the second orthodox country in the world.

In this context, the visit was considered ecumenical and not according to the Catholics' expectations. The Holy Father visited neither Blaj, centre of the greek-catholic Church nor Bacau, in the middle of Moldavia, a roman-catholic region.

Friday, on his arrival, John Paul II paid the official visits: in the morning to the Holy Synod of the orthodox Church and in the afternoon to the Republic's President. On May 8th he started with visiting the churchyard Bellu, where he stopped in prayer on the tombs of the Bishops Martyrs of the greek-catholic Church.

He went then into the roman-catholic Cathedral in Bucarest, that is dedicated to Saint Joseph, where he concelebrated with the Metropolite Lucian Muresan, all the Bishops of the greek rite and with the roman-catholic Metropolite Ioan Robu. More than 900 priests were presents as well as official personages and many faithful. The Pope greeted Card. Todes who was also present.

Sunday 9th May in the morning the Pope attended the celebration of the Patriarch Teocrist. About 100 people were present - orthodoxes and catholics - coming from all the regions of the country. In the afternoon, the Holy Father concelebrated a mass in latin rite with the Metropolite Ioan Robu, with the participation of more than 500,000 faithful from whole Romania, bringing banners and flags. It was a moment of deep spirituality. The whole visit is a very important step from a point of view both political and ecumenical, a sign of that spiritual communion to which all men aspire. A great event.

PONTIFICAL COUNCIL FOR THE LAITY MEETING NOVEMBER 2000

Through ICA's national President, IFCA is participating in the preparation of the World Lay Meeting promoted by the Pontifical Council for the Laity and which will be held in November 2000 in Rome.
